



# OJCS Reading Challenge 2019-2020

The OJCS Reading Challenge is back, but this year bigger and better!

The prizes this year will be,

- an end-of-year book-based film screening or book-themed dress-up party in each classroom that meets their goals. The library will provide each class with popcorn and candy treats.
- Middle school will once again compete for an escape room to create an added incentive.
- Small prizes will be given out to each student who gets a Bingo on the genre bingo sheet that goes with the challenge.

## HOW IT WILL WORK

Last year there was some confusion around how the books read were tallied. This year it will be very precise.

For grades 5 - 8:

- By completing an AR quiz

For grades K-4 choose the methods that work best for your students:

- For our youngest students, a drawing connected to the book.

Use whatever method you prefer to keep a record on the number of books read per student. Total class book tallies will be collected at the end of May as well as the names of top contributors. Because of stricter tally methods the numbers won't look as dramatic as last year but they will be more meaningful.

# The OJCS Reading Challenge Bingo

When you get a bingo, visit the library to get a prize.  
 Keep in mind it only counts if you've done one of the tally methods outlined by your teacher. Teachers need to initial each goal met.  
 Selections need to be age and reading level appropriate.
